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STAYING HAPPY AT 86

In the quiet enclave of Bukit Merah View, Mr Chua Kim Teck, an indomitable 86-year-old soul, gracefully manoeuvres through life's ebbs and flows. Dwelling alone, he carries the echoes of a bygone era, having bid farewell to his partner, traversing the currents of life as a solitary figure. Yet, he embraces this solitude with grace, finding happiness in being alone. During our cheerful rendezvous at the Ghim

Moh KDF Dialysis Centre, where Mr Chua welcomed me with an energetic handshake and a friendly tone, "Hello Bellamy, nice meeting you at KDF Ghim Moh!" - a poignant moment unfolded. It became evident that in addition to his resilience, Mr Chua stands as one of the eldest patients at KDF, a testament to the enduring spirit that graces the halls of the dialysis centre.

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
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The tapestry of Mr Chua's daily routine is woven with simplicity and purpose. He revels in the serenity of Tiong Bahru Garden to take morning and evening walks, choosing to retire early at 8 PM and rise with the sun at 4 AM. His mornings also unfold with a pilgrimage to the market, a testament to his zest for life's simple pleasures. In the stillness of dawn, Mr Chua delights in a breakfast of Teo Chew porridge or vegetarian bee hoon, savouring flavours that transport him to a world of nostalgia.

Peering into the sepia-toned photograph from over four decades ago reveals a younger Mr Chua, a vibrant echo of his taxi-driving days. Until the age of 73, he navigated the streets with a zest for life, having acquired a license in 1957.

The tale takes an adventurous turn with the mention of a "naughty period," during which Mr Chua operated an unlicensed taxi, weaving through bustling streets and picking up passengers. His favourite route, the airport, not only promised a modest income of \$30 per day at that time but also led to encounters with kind-hearted passengers.

During his heyday, Mr Chua also smoked and gambled, consuming at least 4 packs of cigarettes daily, a habit he quit in his mid-50s.

Mr Chua's life has seen its share of challenges, including the recent passing of his sister at 85, leaving behind a lingering sense of grief.

Following the passing of his wife, his sister, and the CKD diagnosis — Mr Chua initially grappled with the notion of undergoing dialysis at the age of 86. The weight of these experiences made him question the meaning of prolonging his life through medical interventions.

Amidst these difficulties, he opened up about his late wife, a companion in both joy and sorrow.

She worked as a stall helper at a coffee shop, contributing to the family's well-being until her passing in 2012. Her absence created a lasting void, but Mr Chua holds her memory close in his heart. Recently, in 2022, he was diagnosed with Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD) at Singapore General Hospital, adding another layer to his life journey. Through these ups and downs, Mr Chua's resilience shines as he faces life's complexities with the support of his nephew, Teo Hong.

However, in this challenging juncture, his nephew's heartfelt encouragement served as a catalyst. He prompted Mr Chua to reconsider and embark on the journey of dialysis, viewing it not as a mere medical necessity but as an opportunity to embrace and cherish his golden years with the care and support of those who hold him dear.

His nephew, Teo Hong, a taxi driver

himself, checks in on Mr Chua every fortnight. This familial connection becomes a lifeline, offering companionship and ensuring that Mr Chua is not alone in his musings.

Amidst the challenges of health and loss, Mr Chua's spirit remains resolute. His post-dialysis routine is a delicate dance of adjustments, a testament to the fortitude with which he confronts the nuances of his health. Despite dietary restrictions, Mr Chua finds joy in the occasional treats of indulging in his favourite plate of Nasi Briyani topped with some fried delights, relishing each morsel as a celebration of his long-lived years. However, mindful of his health, he exercises caution not to overindulge, recognising the importance of moderation. Postdialysis, he faces the challenge of slightly low blood pressure. Yet, the dedicated medical team at KDF makes necessary adjustments and closely monitors him, ensuring his well-being remains a top priority.

In the lively community at KDF, Mr Chua discovered a kindred spirit in Mr Tan Eng Hwa. The bond they formed transcends the boundaries of the dialysis centre, evolving into a friendship that extends beyond its confines. Sharing their experiences and emotions during dialysis sessions, both find solace in the comfort of companionship and mutual understanding.

Facing life's challenges, Mr Chua draws support from various sources. The government's thoughtful gesture of providing goodie bags

filled with necessities to elderly residents, like him, who live alone, adds a heartwarming touch. He also enjoys subsidies from his MSF Public Assistance card when going about his daily activities.

The steadfast support
of Mr Chua's nephew and
the assistance of social workers
from his community club further
contribute to the robust support
system that envelops him. In this
network of care and understanding,
Mr Chua navigates the complexities
of his health journey with a sense
of communal strength and
shared camaraderie.

KDF GOT TO WALK 2023 CHARITY WALKATHON – ILLUMINATING LIFE

The 5KM walkathon, themed 'Illuminating Life,' aimed to spark a chain reaction of positivity, leaving a lasting impact on those affected by kidney disease. The mascot's bib number, 1234, signifies the dialysis treatment routine that kidney patients have to undergo, 12 hours of dialysis treatment a week, 3 times a week, and 4hrs for each dialysis session, serving as a poignant reminder of the challenges faced by kidney patients.



仔细观察这张四十多年前棕褐色的 照片,这是蔡先生年轻时开出租车 充满活力的模样。1957年获得执照 的蔡先生,直到73岁,还依然那么 喜欢在路上开车。

但,提到了"淘气时期" 蔡先生有着令人意想不到的一面。在那段时期,蔡先生经营着一辆无执照的出租车,穿梭于街道之间。熙熙攘攘的街道,载着乘客。他最喜欢的路径是前往机场,当时每天的收入不仅有\$30,而且还遇到善良的乘客们。

在他的全盛时期,蔡先生不只抽烟还赌博,而且每天至少吸上4包烟, 直到50多岁的时候才戒掉这个习惯。 随着妻子和妹妹去世的打击后,又收到被诊断出慢性肾病,86岁的他最初犹豫是否要接受洗肾治疗的想法。这些人生经历深深的影响了他,

蔡先生的一生经历过不少的挑战, 其中也包括最近他 85 岁的妹妹刚 去世,带来了许多的悲痛。在这些困 难中,他讲述了他已故的妻子,蔡女 士是一位悲喜交加的伴侣。以往的 她在一家咖啡店工作,为家人补贴 家用,直到在2012年去世。她的 离世造成了蔡先生永恒的空虚 感,但蔡先牛将把她牢牢地记 在心里。于2022年,他在新加坡 中央医院被诊断出患有慢性肾 病(CKD),又在此让蔡先生面临 了另一项挑战。经历了这些起起 落落,蔡先生在侄子Teo Hong 的 支持下面对生活的难题,展现出他 坚韧不拔的精神。

他甚至还质疑过接受治疗延长生命的意义何在。

然而,在这段艰难的 期间,侄子Teo Hong的鼓 励对他来说起来很大的作用。 他的鼓励促使蔡先生重新考虑 是否接受洗肾治疗,他认为这不 仅仅是个治疗,而是在亲人的关 心和支持下能够珍惜自己黄 金岁月的机会。

面对生命种种苦难的挑战,蔡先生的毅力非常的坚定。他因洗肾的关系,日常生活都面对着许多的改变,但这也显出了他坚韧的精神。尽管受到饮食限制,蔡先生偶尔还是会享用到他最喜欢的一盘印度炒饭,再搭配上一些油炸食品,以此庆祝他长寿。然而,为了顾及他的健康,他谨慎行事,不能过度放纵,知道压略低的挑战。然而,KDF的专业医疗团队密切观察了他,确保他的健康仍然保持在水平上。

在 KDF 这紧密的社区中,蔡先生发现了与陈永华先生非常的投缘。他们之间建立的友情超乎了想象,成为了洗肾中心模范的友谊。在洗肾期间分享他们的经历和情感,两人再彼此的陪伴下找到了安慰。
